There is no harder job than being a parent. Nothing else touches so much of a person so deeply—or unpredictably—and there is no training for it. This was true pre-COVID, as the pace of life accelerated, media influences intensified, and the future grew less predictable. So it's no wonder parents now find it harder to be confident, how to reduce their children's stress—and their own. Dr. Evans will outline these dilemmas and offer concrete suggestions for successful coping.

Rob Evans is a psychologist, a former high school and pre-school teacher, and a former child and family therapist. He has worked with schools and parents throughout the country, including Hamilton-Wenham. His presentations are known for their lively wit and plain talk. He is the author of many articles and three books, including *Family Matters: How Schools Can Cope with The Crisis in Childrearing*.

The Department of Public Health advises parents of the following info: In the event that your child has symptoms suspicious of COVID-19 and needs to be tested please be advised that the Department of Public Health recommends a PCR (molecular) test as opposed to an antigen test. The PCR test is currently considered the "gold standard".

Mandatory Flu Vaccinations: The state of Massachusetts has mandated that students in grades K -12 receive a flu vaccine by December 31, 2020. The rationale is to prevent an influenza outbreak while simultaneously dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic. Currently there are two exemptions: a medical exemption which requires a physician's note and a religious exemption which necessitates a note from the parent/guardian. Together we can stay healthy!!
